- a. Approval of Meeting Minutes for April 4, 2022

Reports and Presentations

- a. FDOT Report
Mr. Sergio Figuera, FDOT, provided an overview of state roads vulnerability and assessment:
 - FDOT looked at all state roads within the District from Manatee County to Collier County.
 - Assessed the roads by looking at all the different interpretations of the different sea level rises.
 - Did a "birds eye view" of what roads may be susceptible to King Tide, with sea level rise on top of King Tide flooding.
 - Phase 2 of the report has been completed which was coming up with a list of projects to identify roadway segments to try and pair up with future roadway projects and look at a more design detailed view.

b. MPO Report

L RTP Resiliency / Vulnerability Assessment Study Update: DRAFT Methodology Chapters

Ms. Colleen McGue, Kimley Horn, and Kate Widness, Kimley Horn Northern Virginia Office, presented the Sarasota/Manatee MPO's development of Draft Methodology for its L RTP Resilience/Vulnerability Study:

- Chapters 1: Introduction and Summary of Prior Studies and Chapter 2: Data and Resources, have been completed.
- Chapter 3 is to identify methodology and assess vulnerability for critical transportation assets based on available data.
- Chapter 4: is to identify method and assess risk in order to prioritize assets and target funding at locations that have a high probability of failing that would result in significant consequences.
- Currently working on Chapter 5: Mitigation Options to reduce or eliminate damage disruption.
- Chapter 6: to develop the process to rank and prioritize mitigation projects and recommendations for updating overall MPO project prioritization.
- Completion of all Chapters is expected to occur in September with a final report to be presented to the MPO Board and its committees.
- Vulnerability assessment results are going to provide the MPO with an understanding of the systems vulnerabilities and support making decisions on how to best prioritize solutions with limited resources.
- Understanding the probability and severity of hazard impacts can help the MPO make more informed decisions about the costs and benefits of potential mitigation options.
- Risk assessment results will be used to develop a prioritized list of assets that are vulnerable to and at-risk impacts from 3 things: 1. Storm surge; 2. Nuisance flooding; and 3. Wildfires.

The Members were emailed a fillable PDF for feedback to assist in refining some of the components of the vulnerability assessment as well as the risk assessment.
